

Cruisin' Day: Trip to Powder King

Dear Parents:

The School Bus will be **leaving** from the **School** on **Saturday, January 19th at 7:00 am**. Participants should be there at **6:45am**, particularly if they have equipment that needs to be stored in the Bus (snowboards, skis, etc). The lifts close at 3:00 (4:00 our time)... we should be back at the School by about 6:30-7:00 pm. Rules are stated below so that you are aware of them:

1. Participants with no experience **must** take a lesson (2 hours) before skiing/snowboarding.
2. Participants must always be in a group of at least 3.
3. Participants must follow all rules listed here as well as Powder King's rules (ski in designated areas, wear proper equipment).
4. Participants must wear a helmet to prevent head injuries.
5. Participants must have a completed and signed waiver/consent form **and Powder Kings release of liability form**.

Please use the attached Rate sheet to calculate and provide \$ for lift ticket and rentals with their permission form by Monday, January 14th. (If sending a cheque, make payable to Hudson's Hope School Cruisin' Days).

I recommend bringing a lunch and beverages as prices at the lodge are quite expensive. **Please note: Funds have been provided to "Cruisin Days" to reduce the fees for participants that could not take part otherwise. PLEASE contact me if you need help in this area!!**

As skiing/snowboarding is regarded as a "high - risk" activity by our school board, please fill out the attached consent waivers/forms...I apologize for the length but it's a necessity. Please contact me if you have **any** questions or concerns. **Be sure to initial all applicable areas.**

Also, Powder King now has snowshoe rentals, as well as snowshoe trails!

2. Falling down.
3. Use of the T-bar and chairlift.
4. Rugged terrain.
5. Weather
6. Equipment breakage, failures
7. Delayed rescue, accessibility
8. Conduct of the guide, chaperone or other group members.
9. The possibility that your child may not heed safety instructions or restrictions given to the group.

Read Before Signing Liability Waiver

You will soon be partaking in a Ski & Snowboard Education Program at **Powder King Mountain Resort Inc** with your group. You may or may not be familiar with the sport of skiing and/or snowboarding and as such we wish to inform you of the following.

How Safe Is Skiing?

The perception that skiing is a high-risk activity is a myth. Statistically less people are injured skiing per 1,000 participants than a sport such as track & field, basketball, or baseball. Unfortunately, some accidents do occur, you should be aware that it is possible that you could be injured while participating in the Ski Program. If you are not willing to assume this risk, you may wish to reconsider participating. Most accidents occur while skiing out of control or by skiing on terrain above one's ability. Because skiing is an individual sport in a largely uncontrolled environment the responsibility rests with each persons decision on where and how they choose to ski. Powder King employs Ski Patrol with First Aid & Emergency training. It should be noted that if the Ski Patrol feels the situation is urgent enough, Paramedic (Ambulance) assistance will be called. If there is any medical history or information that the Ski Patrol should be made aware of, please ensure the Group Supervisor is advised so that vital information can be passed on to the Ski Patrol on duty.

How safe is Snowboarding?

Snowboarding has an associated risk similar to skiing (please read the outline above), however, boarding in terrain parks, boarding above one's ability, or doing free-style maneuvers without proper preparation or training increases the likelihood of injury.

SNOWBOARDING I understand that the boot/binding system for this equipment is not designed or intended to release under normal circumstances. I understand that the boot/ binding system is a non-release system, this system will not reduce the risk of injury during a fall.

I FREELY ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME ALL RISKS, DANGERS, AND HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF THE EQUIPMENT.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY, AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK

AS A CONDITION OF YOUR USE OF THE SKI AREA FACILITIES, THE PARTICIPANT ASSUMES ALL RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR PROPERTY LOSS RESULTING FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE INHERENT RISKS OF SKIING, SNOWBOARDING, SNOWSHOEING & ANY/ALL WINTER ACTIVITIES. THE USE OF SKI LIFTS, COLLISIONS WITH NATURAL OR MAN-MADE OBJECTS OR OTHER SKIERS OR SNOWBOARDERS, TRAVEL WITHIN OR BEYOND THE SKI AREA BOUNDARIES OR NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OF CONTRACT, OR BREACH OF STATUTORY DUTY OF CARE ON THE PART OF THE SKI AREA OPERATOR, AND ITS EMPLOYEES, AND AGENTS. THE SCHOOL PARTICIPANT AGREES THAT THE SKI AREA OPERATOR AND ITS EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY SUCH PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH OR PROPERTY LOSS AND RELEASES THE SKI AREA OPERATOR AND ITS EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS AND WAIVES ALL CLAIMS WITH RESPECT THERETO.

THERE ARE ELEMENTS OF RISK THAT COMMON SENSE AND PERSONAL AWARENESS CAN HELP REDUCE. REGARDLESS OF HOW YOU DECIDE TO USE THE SLOPES, ALWAYS SHOW COURTESY TO OTHERS. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE CODE LISTED BELOW AND SHARE WITH OTHERS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR A SAFE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.

- 1** *Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects.*
- 2** *People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.*
- 3** *Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.*
- 4** *Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.*
- 5** *If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.*
- 6** *Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.*
- 7** *Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.*
- 8** *Keep off closed trails and closed areas.*
- 9** *You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.*
- 10** *You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.*
